3. How is this covenant similar to (and different from) previous biblical covenants (Genesis 3:15; Genesis 9; Genesis 12, 15, 17; Exodus 24)? In what important ways does this chapter move forward God's plan to save a people through Jesus?
4. How is this promise to David also good news for us?
5. How should we respond to this good news? How is David an example for us to follow?
